- April Barry presented the PCC Cancer Clinical Trials Collaborative and Project Echo. Project Echo – is a collaborative model of medical education and care management that helps clinicians provide expert-level care to patients wherever they live. Using video-conferencing technology to train, advise, and support primary care providers, Project ECHO increases access to specialty treatment in rural and underserved areas for a variety of conditions. The targeted audience is healthcare professionals.
